How to use infrared cameras to monitor what wildlife has returned post fires

Mountain Landcare has purchased 8 infrared cameras through funding from a Landcare Australia fire recovery grant. Now we need to learn how to use them!

Stephanie Clark from National Parks Association of NSW is coming to Tumbarumba to run a workshop called 'Who's Living on my Land?'. This workshop will train landholders how to set up cameras to monitor ground dwelling wildlife (both native and feral). After the workshop landholders can loan a camera from Mountain Landcare to monitor what's moving about on their land.
